Oasis Association was established in 1952 and helps enable people with intellectual disabilities to become as independent as possible in the community through day centres, workshops, residential facilities and supplementary programmes. One of Oasis' projects is Recycling and Waste Management where the focus is on recycling and re-using items. Western Cape residents can bring recyclable items to Oasis where their dedicated workforce will sort through it and prepare for recycling. Oasis' Elsie's River protective workshop centre recently succumbed to severe fire. Oasis believes it was started by thieves, which forced the non-profit organisation to evacuate the premises. "It will take us about nine months to rebuild the centre and make it habitable again for the disabled workers. The donation from the IWMSA will help tremendously to rebuild our centre," says Jagers.
